# Paula Most

#### BIO:

As the Coordinator for the Arts at Lifespan in Providence, Rhode Island, Paula Most initiates and coordinates multidisciplinary, collaborative art programs for both adults and children at Rhode Island Hospital, Hasbro Children's Hospital and other Lifespan affiliates. Paula, who is founder and director of the hospital-based Museum on Rounds Art Program, an art program for pediatric patients, supervises and trains students from various colleges and universities by introducing them to methods of incorporating the arts into a healthcare setting. Museum on Rounds began as a collaborative effort between the Child Life Department of Hasbro Children's Hospital and The Museum of Art, Rhode Island School of Design (RISD).

Paula is a former adjunct professor in the Art Education Department at Rhode Island College and former art instructor in RISD's Pre-College Program. She was employed for over ten years at the Museum of Art, RISD. A former board member of Society for the Arts in Healthcare (SAH), now known as the National Organization for Arts in Health (NOAH), Paula provided consultation services to numerous healthcare institutions throughout the country and was the recipient of the 2011 SAH Janice Palmer award. She remains an active member of the organization. She was the 2010 recipient of the Rhode Island Arts and Business Council Encore Award.

The central theme of Paula's work is heightening awareness of the benefits of art in a healthcare setting. Hospitals offering expressive art programs for their patients, families and staff, and who display artwork throughout the facility, help to raise the public consciousness about the role art plays in humanizing health-care institutions.


